The 1940 football season was not what we would call a howling success, but it was far from discouraging. Our new coach, Tom O'Donnell, took the driver's seat, and in September his green team arrived in Salem. That afternoon resulted in the greatest excitement to hit Newburyport since 1922. The Clippers—under a new principal, a new coach, and a new system—took the Witches in their stride, setting them back 6-0. The old town was turned upside down by efforts to show exuberance and appreciation. Every available noise-maker was put into use. For the first time in many a year City Hall was opened that night for a victory dance. Some say that Mr. Nock brought us luck. Some suggest that the Clippers' new coach and new system were entirely responsible. Some even say that it was the law of averages. But ask any true follower of the team, and you will get the right answer. It was the spirit of the boys themselves; they wouldn't be beaten.

That was the start of a fairly successful season. The team went on to win five and lose five. The record made was no better than the record of the team of '39, although we did take our two greatest rivals into camp. But football spirit ran higher this season than in years before. Confidence in the team was a fact, not a theory.

Such was the setting when the Clippers sailed into Amesbury. The day was warm, and the snow was melting. Everywhere was slush and mud. But the crowd jammed the up-river stadium just the same. From beginning to end the game was a real classic. The ball was pushed back and forth over the muddy field, with most of the play in Amesbury territory. But the boys



couldn't score. Then came the ending that we see in the movies often, but seldom anywhere else. An unknown, Charlie O'Brien '41, went into the game in the last few minutes, kicked a field goal, and the Clippers won, 3-0. That was the thrilling and unforgettable end of an eventful season.
